About The College

Barrackpore Rastraguru Surendranath College, founded in 1953, is a UGC registered College [under 2(f) & 12(b)] & Re-accredited by NAAC (Third Cycle Re-accreditation) in 2014. A group of dedicated men, led by Dr. Satish Bose, a noted social worker, took the initiative of establishing this institution on 19th September, 1953 and named it after one of the most illustrious sons of Barrackpore and India, Rastraguru Surendranath Bandopadhyay.

The institution initially functioned from Debiprasad High School and in 1954 was shifted to 6, Riverside Road as an institution affiliated to the University of Calcutta. In 1969, the college bought a plot of land at 85 Middle Road for further expansion. From the session 2008-09, the college is affiliated to the West Bengal State University.

Over the years the college has consolidated its position as a premier institution in West Bengal imparting learning in diverse areas of Humanities, Commerce, Science and Management. Emerging Subjects in the field of Applied Sciences such as Computer Science, Electronic Science, Microbiology, Psychology, Food & Nutrition are given due emphasis.



Our college is the first Govt. aided College in the state to have participated in the third cycle re-accreditation and awarded with score 3.08 (A) by NAAC up to June 2019. In keeping with the institution's objectives of 'Advancement of Learning' and 'Need-based Higher Education' and also to cope with the explosion of demand for PG Studies, the college started PG Courses with affiliation from University of Calcutta since 2004-05 session. Presently it covers PG studies in six subjects on autonomous basis : M.Sc. (Microbiology, Computer Science, Geography and Food & Nutrition), M.Com. (Accounts, Finance & Control and Marketing Management) under affiliation from West Bengal State University. The college is about to introduce M.A. in Education & Hindi and M.Sc. in Mathematics very soon.

For catering the need of the society and to increase the coverage of higher education in the state, the college has started Post Graduate Courses under Distance Learning mode from 2015 – 2016 academic session in various subjects (M.A. in Bengali, English, History; M.Sc. in Botany, Zoology, Environmental Science; M.Com in Farm Management) under affiliation from Directorate of Distance Education, Vidyasagar University, Midnapore. M.Sc in Physics and Dietetics & Community Nutrition is about to be opened.

The college has been awarded with the status of '**College with Potential for Excellence**' (CPE) by the University Grants Commission (New Delhi) in the year 2016. This scheme has identified the college as an institution which has attained high standard in Teaching, Research and Extension Activities and holds a promise for excellence. Through this status the college will be provided with substantial funds to improve and strengthen its infrastructure that would help it in attaining further higher academic standards and improvement of teaching-learning environment. Further, this will enable the college to carry out research and outreach programmes that would be comparable to global standards.

According to a survey conducted by 'Education World', the college is ranked as 48th best college in India (6th in West Bengal) Considering all sorts of streams of education taught (Arts & Humanities, Science & Commerce. As per another survey conducted by Times of India, the college has been ranked 84th in India (3rd in Kolkata) among the colleges teaching Arts, 96th in India (3rd in Kolkata) among the colleges teaching commerce. In 2018, the college obtained ISO 9001:2015 certifications for quality assurance in imparting UG and PG education.

The Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India, has Selected a handful of academic institutions to receive funds under RUSA scheme, of which our college is a proud recipient. Our college has been selected for RUSA Fund and received Rs 1.23 crores against approved amount of Rs 2.0 crores. The college has been utilising this fund and utilisation certificate of Rs 50 lakhs have already been sent for the first phase and an utilisation certificate for an amount of Rs 30 lakhs is on process.

Our students have been performing brilliantly in different streams in university examinations. The success rate being nearly hundred percent for the last few years. In keeping with its growing reputation, the college has become a favoured destination of some of the most high-profile names in the corporate world, who have been regularly conducting campus interviews. On that basis our students are regularly being recruited by manufacturing and service providing business houses of highest reputation. It would not be out of place to mention in this context that the introduction of Value Added Co-curricular activities is largely responsible for the enhanced employability of our students.

In tune with the recent development in some of the best educational institutions in the world, our college has introduced Value Based Education, is a programme aimed at developing the ethical and humane potential of our students.

The faculty members provide academic counseling, Value-based Education to the students through structured routine.

At least two Departmental Seminars or Workshops are conducted in a year by each department with active participation of the students.

Teachers are getting involved in Research programmes increasingly. At present thirty Minor & five Major research (DBT Projects- Govt. of India & Govt. of West Bengal) projects are in operation. College funds a lump-sum amount as seed money in its budget for the Research activities of the teachers and student.

College has organized successfully the 11th Career Fair on 5-22-23 February, 2018.

Like previous years, Centre for Career Development and Placement Cell (CCD) of the college has been organizing Campus Recruitment Drives in association with large number of reputed corporate houses and a good number of students are selected every year. The Centre for Career Development and Placement Cell of college has been conducting Special Employability Training by Tata Consultancy Services. Besides, certificate course for developing communication skills in English and Aptitude-Numerical and Logical Reasoning skills is also conducted in parallel mode for grooming of students in CCD. Details about these are given in the Placement Brochure.

♦ In the session 2017-18, the college has registered its work in the field of sports and games. 13 students of the college has become University Blue. The male football and badminton team become champion and the female handball team become 'runners-up' in the WBSU organized tournaments.

♦ The college athletics team became champion in the 24 Parganas (North) District Inter-College Tournament Organized by Dept. of Education, Govt. of West Bengal. Rajkumar Pal, a student of this college achieved individual medal for his performance in that tournament. The college football team also performed outstanding in the All India Reliance Tournament. Saikat Mandal, goal keeper of the college football team achieved 'Golden Glove' for his individual performance in the tournament. The college football team also become champion in the Inter-College Tournament under West Bengal State University.

♦ College has been awarded FIST (Level-O) under Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India. The college is also awarded BOOST under Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of West Bengal.

♦ College organizes "Rastraguru Surendranath Bandyopadhyay Memorial Lecture" every year.

♦ The Cultural Sub-committee of the college organizes a Cultural Programme every year to celebrate the birthday of Kabiguru Rabindranath Tagore and also organizes a cultural programme 'Agomoni', to celebrate the initiation Durga Puja festival.

♦ The Dept. of Chemistry, Zoology & Botany along with IQAC organized a UGC-CPE funded 7 day State Level workshop on 'Refreshing Chemistry for Biologists', during 13th -20th December, 2017. Prof. Sanjib Ghosh, Prof. Ranjan Das, Prof. Sujoy Ghosh, Prof. Chandrakanta Banerjee, Prof. Ashish Kumar Panigrahi were among the eminent resource persons in the workshop.

♦ Dept. of Physics & IQAC organized a UGC-CPE funded one Day State Level Seminar on 'Recent Trends in Physics : Research & Education' on 8th December, 2017 Prof. Kalyan Kumar Chattopadhyay (J.U), Dr. Anirban Saha (WBSU), Prof Bijoy Modak (KU) were among the invited speakers in that seminar.

♦ A UGC-CPE funded two Day workshop on 'Safety Awareness' was organized 15th February, 2018 by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC).

About The College

♦ Dept. of Electronic Science & IQAC organized a UGC-CPE funded one Day National Level Seminar on 'Electronics Multidisciplinary Applications' on 23rd February, 2018 in association with IQAC. Prof. Monojit Mitra, Dr Sanat Kumar Das and Prof. Debiprasad Duari, Scientist NASA & Director, Birla Planetarium Were the resource persons in the seminar.

♦ Dept. of Computer Science & IQAC jointly organized a UGC-CPE funded on Day State Level Seminar on 'Recent Trends in Computer Science' on 6th March, 2018. Among the eminent speakers in the seminar there was Prof. Jyotsna Kumar Mondal, Dr. Sarbani Palit and Prof. Utpal Biswas.

♦ A UGC-CPE funded one Day Teachers' orientation Programme on 'CBCS in UG Courses' was organized on 28th March, 2018. Sri A Mukherjee, OSD & controller of Examinations, WBSU and Dr. Bimalendu Biswas, controller of Examination, KU were the speakers in the programme.

♦ The women Empowerment subcommittee of the college organized a UGC-CPE funded workshop on 'Basic Skills in Photography' for the SC female Students' of the college on 29th March, 2018. Mr. Joydeep Banerjee, Film Maker & Mr. Ashes Mukherjee acted as the resource persons in it.

♦ A workshop titled 'Institutional Accreditation : An Endeavor towards Excellence' was held on 18th September, 2017 to make the teaches & non-teaching staff familiar with the new system of NAAC accreditation. Dr B.S. Madhukar, Director, NAAC acted as the resource person in that workshop.

♦ Our college has been selected for RUSA fund and received Rs 1.23 crores against approved amount of Rs 2.0 crores. The college has been utilising this fund and utilisation certificate of Rs. 79 lakhs have already been sent in two installment and an utilization certificate for a further amount of Rs 40 lakhs (approx) is on process.

♦ The following works have already been done with the above fund, viz. buying of scientific instruments, desktop and laptop computers, smart boards, LCD projectors, photocopier machines, up gradation of the class rooms of Journalism and Film Studies, up gradation of Language Lab, up gradation of students' canteens in both the buildings, Accounts Section, replacement of old windows by two-track sliding windows, Illumination and up gradation

of Room No. 216 of 6, Riverside Road campus, buying library books, software, Sports and Games items etc.

♦ College has also taken the initiatives for more construction and renovation works under the RUSA fund. The cycle garage at 85 Middle Road Campus is renovated and on the First floor of the cycle garage, two class rooms have been constructed. The 2nd floor of Block 'E' has been constructed to create some more class rooms. Also the construction works of first floor of the boys hostel is complete. Vertical rail for physically challenged students in the 6, Riverside Road campus is also proposed to be made under the RUSA fund.

♦ College received MPLAD fund of Rs. 20 lakhs for construction of the 2nd floor of 'E' Block at 6, Riverside Road Campus. Room No. 226 of 85, Middle Road Campus of the College has been renovated and it has been reconstructed as a seminar hall cum digital class room through Utilization of the Bidhayak Elaka Unnayan Prkalpo (BEUP) fund.

♦ College organizes workshops as Outreach Programme for the teachers of neighbouring institutes.

♦ Centre for Thalassaemia Eradication in collaboration with Indian Red Cross Society, Barrackpore and Dept. of Health, Govt. of West Bengal is working with the aim at eradicating Thalassaemia in the neighborhood. The college is going to replace the old Thalassaemia detection machine by an advance version very soon. The process of replacement has already been started.

♦ Success rate of our students in the University examinations is nearly hundred percent (97-98% in 2017), with first class (11.12% - 2017, 17.06% -2016, 18.13% -2015) and rank holders. A very good number of first ranks indicate its top position amongst the 47 colleges in the University.

♦ Apart from the Undergraduate Courses of study, the college also conducts Post Graduates courses in seven subjects, Vig, M.A. in Education, M.Sc. in Geography, Microbiology, Computer Science, Food & Nutrition and M.Com in Accounts, Finance & control and Marketing Management. M.Sc in Mathematics and M.A. in Hindi are about to be introduced very shortly.

♦ The College maintains two NSS Units to impart Sense of social responsibility among the students. Presently 100 Students per unit are enrolled as NSS volunteers in the college. A large number of regular social services are performed by NSS throughout the year. One special camp is also organized by each Unit separately in the neighboring Barrackpore & North Barrackpore Municipal Areas.

◆ The College also conducts Postgraduate courses under Distance Education affiliated to Directorate of Distance Education, Vidya Sagar University. Currently the college offers seven subjects viz, M.Sc. in Botany, Zoology, Environmental Science, M.A. in Bengali, English, History and M.Com in Farm Management. M.Sc in Physics and Dietetics & Community Nutrition are about to be introduced very shortly.

◆ Both campuses of the college are green, eco-friendly and free from plastic. Beautiful gardens are maintained in both the campuses. A herbal garden is maintained in the 85, Middle Road Campus. A butterfly garden is proposed to be made on the bank of river Ganga in the 6, Riverside Road Campus.

◆ The College publishes two research journals on bi-yearly basis. The first journal 'Journal of Business and Economic Issues', is published by Department of Commerce and accommodates research papers in the areas of Commerce, Management & Economics. The Second journal BRSC College-Vision' is a Multidisciplinary journal which accommodates research papers from different subjects in the area of Science, Literature, Humanities, Commerce and Management.

◆ Smt Ispita Saha, NCC cadet if of the college participated in the Republic Day camp in New Delhi in 2018. She also participated in the Prime Minister's Rally in New Delhi on the Republic Day of 2018. The college also acted as the venue of number of programme organized by 48th Bengal BN and the college NCC unit. Celebration of the Republic Day, Independence Day, World Youth Day, World Yoga Day are some of these programmes organized by the college. NCC cadets of the college also participated in the National Integration Camp.

◆ The college has opened a cash office for collection of Library fines at 6, Riverside Road Campus of the college.

◆ In 2018. the college obtained ISO 9001:2015 certification for quality assurance in imparting UG and PG education. The College had already applied for obtaining ISO 14001:2015 as a mark environment friendly campuses.

◆ The college obtained 48th rank in India and 6th rank in West Bengal in the list of best multidisciplinary (Science, Arts & Commerce) colleges as per a survey conducted by 'Education world'. As per survey of 'India Today' Magazine the college is awarded as 3rd best college in West Bengal in all (Science, Arts & Commerce.) the three streams of education.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

General

- All Students are accountable to the Principal for their conduct in college.
- Academic Callender is distributed to the students at the beginning of the academic year. Students are advised to be punctual and to attend all lectures regularly.
- Under the University Notification No. CSR/64/99, a candidate shall be considered as collegiate if he/she attends 75% lectures in any subject, and as non-collegiate if attendance in any subject falls short of 75% but not below 60%. A candidate who has not attended at least 60% lectures shall be considered discollegiate & shall be debarred from appearing at any examination.

In case of absence due to illness, students are required to submit to the Principal a medical certificate with a letter from the parents (guardian) explaining the reasons for absence.

- Students are required to carry their Identity Cards bearing their photographs. Without Identity card no student will be allowed to enter the college campus.
- Smoking and Spitting is forbidden in the college premises.
- Any student found guilty of damaging college property or of any other form of indiscipline like writing on/defacing walls will be severely punished.
- All college excursions or outings require prior permission from the Principal.
- Fees and other charges are payable in advance within the 15th of every month. In case of delay or non-payment, the same will be collected with a delay fine within a period of 3 months from the due date. In case of default, the name of the student will be struck off for non-payment of fees and/or other charges.
- Medium of Instruction in PG Courses is English.

UGC DRAFT REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

“...Ragging is totally banned in the college and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately”. Anyone found guilty of ragging shall be liable to punishment such as, Cancellation of Admission, Suspension from attending classes, Debarring from appearing in any examination, Fine of Rs. 25000/- etc. From the academic year 2015-16 a student must have to submit an undertaking that in case of he/she is found guilty of ragging, he/she shall be liable to punishment under UGC regulation.

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ADMISSION PROCEDURE :

Admission will be held completely online. Applicants are to log on to the college website (www.brsnc.org) for all admission related information process. Merit lists and all other notifications will be made available in the college website. Admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit. Students seeking admission are required to pass in the Honours course of B.A./B.Sc. and B.Com/BBA (as applicable) without any PNC (Part not cleared). Students will be able to download the application form only after submitting the registration fee of Rs.350/-.

Guidelines for PG Admission for the Session 2018-19

1. **Admission to M.A., M.Sc. & M.Com.** Course will be made on the basis of marks /grade obtained by the candidate at the Graduation level or equivalent examination recognized by affiliating University and other criteria as started by the institution and as per guideline of the WBSCHE.
2. A candidate who has passed 3-year B.Sc./BA/B.Com/BBA Examination with Honours/Major in respective subjects and related subjects from West Bengal State University, C.U or universities recognized by UGC can apply for admission to the M.A./M.Sc/M.Com courses. Candidates other than WBSU/C.U should have completed 3yrs Degree courses in respective/ related subjects and one of the subjects for which admission is sought, should carry at least 800 marks or above. Candidates of Major subjects in vocational status from the state universities or from distance education mode are not eligible for admission in P.G.
3. **ADMISSION WILL BE MADE STRICTLY ON THE BASIS OF MERIT.**
4. **Students seeking admission are required to pass in the Honours course of B.A./B.Sc and B.Com/BBA without any PNC(Part not cleared) in the subject sought for post graduation study.**
5. Admission in all **M.A./ M.Sc. / M.Com.** Courses will be made through Admission Test conducted by respective Departments for the applicants from Other Universities. If any candidate fails to appear in the admission test, his/her right for admission will be forfeited. Merit list will be prepared by the Departments giving weightage on both admission test and the number scored in Honours Examination. (60% of the marks obtained in University exam and 40% marks obtained from admission test) and Departmental decision in this regard will be final. Admission test will be taken for 40 marks and will be of one hour of duration.
6. Admission in all **M.A., M.Sc. & M.Com.** Courses will be made through Merit List prepared by the Departments for the applicants from Home University in their fractional seats. If any candidate fails to attend the verification of documents his /her right for admission will be forfeited . The merit list will be prepared respective by the Departments giving weightage on the number scored in Honours Examination and Departmental decision in this regard will be final.

COMPUTER SCIENCE, MICROBIOLOGY, GEOGRAPHY and FOOD & NUTRITION

OBJECTIVE

Opening of Autonomous Post Graduate courses in different emerging subjects like Computer Science, Microbiology, Geography, Food & Nutrition etc. may develop better scope to the students for their professional career in industry or academic career for further study and research. M.Sc. courses in these subjects are designed to provide quality education in theoretical studies as well as practical training so that the students, on successful completion of the course, may either take up a professional career or attend research activities through academic career.

CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

The curriculum is divided into four semesters under CBCS. Each semester will be of 15 weeks duration. The

curriculum is designed with 104 credit points and has been given proper balance between theory and practical (including project work, case study & lab based practical) papers. Paper 2.1 in the second semester will be a choice based paper. 70 % marks has been allotted for end-semester examination and 30% marks for attendance & internal assessment in each theoretical paper. In a practical paper, 70% marks has been allotted for internal assessment and rest 30% is allotted for viva-voce conducted by external examiners.

OBJECTIVE

With the increasing complexities in the world of trade, industry and business, the scope of Commerce is increasing day by day. Due to globalization of almost all the restricted small national markets, business activities all over the world have been gaining rapid momentum. Commerce, as a result, has opened up new vistas of opportunities, both in industry and in Research and Academic field.

In the world of Commerce, two important areas of interest are –Accounting & Finance and Marketing, both of which are equally important from their context. Finance is creating an immense scope for jobs and research works due to the development of share markets, international trade, globalization of business etc. On the other hand, with the growth of cut-throat competition in almost all spheres of life, proper marketing is perhaps one of the major keys to success. This growing importance of Marketing and Finance certainly requires considerable volume of manpower having specialised knowledge of these subjects.

Keeping this in mind, our college is offering Post-Graduate courses in Commerce (M.Com) with specialization in'

Accounts, Finance and Control

Marketing Management,

under the aegis of West Bengal State University with a greater degree of autonomy in structuring syllabi, conducting examinations and evaluations.

CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

The curriculum is divided into four semesters spread over two years, each semester being of 15 weeks. The curriculum is designed with 100 credit points and framed so as to make proper balance between theory, project work, case studies and lab based practical classes.

The college has given special emphasis on contact teaching and thus for each theoretical paper, internal assessment and attendance carries 30% while written examination on theoretical papers will cover rest 70%. On the other hand, for practical and project work 70% marks is based on internal assessment and rest 30% is on viva-voce conducted by external examiners.

PROJECTION OF THE CURRICULUM

The course syllabi are quite different from the traditional syllabi of different institutions, in the sense to deliver updated and contemporaneous knowledge on the core concepts of business studies with greater emphasis on Accounting & Financial and Marketing Management.

With greater autonomy in updating curriculum under the auspices of P.G. Board of studies, the courses are always under pedagogical vigil to suit the demands of ever-changing business environment. The courses will help to meet better the expectations of the business houses, to inculcate values for entrepreneurship and to allow for vertical value addition by going for higher studies and research work. The curriculum has been designed to place due emphasis on the regularity in attending classes, performance of subject-wise assignments, Case Study on contemporary issues received from newspapers such as Economic Times, Business World etc.& learning Research Methodology within the semester system. Further, special emphasis has been given on practical exposure in the fields of computerized accounting and taxation. This will indeed help to improve the reach of the students in their professional area. The teaching methodology used is a dynamic mix of lectures, case studies & assignments to suit the requirements of the day.

ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT

To appear at the semester examinations one has to secure 75% of the credit per semester (contact teaching) both in theory and practical classes separately.

• LABORATORIES :

College provides well-equipped laboratories for different lab-based Departments: Computer Sc. (5), Electronics (2), Chemistry (5), Physics (3), Microbiology (6), Geography (4), Psychology (4), Food & Nutrition (2) Zoology (2) and 1 each for Botany, Mathematics, Journalism & Mass Communication and Film Studies. Besides these, there are two Language Labs also and an IT Lab for Department of Commerce. College has also set up a Central Instrument Lab for research work funded by DST & UGC.

The college also provides various audio-visual aids like OHP, LCD projector etc. to the students for presentations during seminars, debates and other extra-curricular activities.



• **DIGITAL CLASS ROOMS :**

College provides more than 26 well-equipped digital class rooms with setting of laptop, LCD projector, visualiser, internet connection etc.

Students are also using these facilities for their project presentation, seminar, Group Discussion etc.

• **OFFICE :**

The college office is fully computerized. Students' personal data including their individual results are fed and stored in the computers. The Accounts office is also computerized and takes care of students' fee collection, Daily Accounts, maintaining Cash Book etc. through IBM Rack Server funded by DST. These are handled by the accounting package programme Tally (7.2). The college office is now well-equipped to render smooth and efficient service to more than 5000 students.

• **SEMINAR HALL :**

The college has two large seminar halls in both the campuses with a 250+ seating capacity and equipped with all modern amenities. The seminar hall facilitates the students & teachers to hold seminars and other group activities without disruption of normal classes. There is a seminar hall cum auditorium in the 85, Middle Road campus of the college.

• **SPORTS, GAMES & COACHING:**

The college has a pro-active attitude towards sports and games. It has introduced formal coaching facility in



athletics, cricket, football and gym. Coaching is given by the professional coaches. Besides, the boys and girls students have common room facilities with indoor games like carom, table tennis etc. Annual Sports Meet and inter-class tournaments are organized by the Students' Union. Students are encouraged to participate in inter college, University level, district, state and national level tournaments. Needy sports persons are entitled for free-ship on performance basis. The college became champion in athletics and football in the District Meet at the University level in the last year.

• **STUDENTS' MEDICAL & MEANS AID (ACCIDENT INSURANCE):**

College provides a Medical Health Insurance to the students as accidental benefit, up to a upper limit of Rs. 5,000/-, during their tenure as students of this college.

• **INTERNET FACILITIES:**

Free internet and computer access is available to the students, faculty and staff during the college hours. Students in the girls' hostel also have free access to internet facility. Both campuses of the college are LAN connected. Wi-Fi connection and Internet facility will soon be provided in the boys' hostel too.

• **SCHOLARSHIP & STIPEND:**

- 1) Jayanta Chowdhury Memorial Scholarship — an annual scholarship of Rs. 2,000 (approx).
- 2) 'Maitri Sangha Janakalyan Ashram'—an annual scholarship of Rs. 2,000 (approx).
- 3) Shailabala Devi Memorial Scholarship.
- 4) Teachers' Council provides six stipends to the poor and meritorious students.
- 5) Stipends are awarded to eligible students such as Hindi Scholarship, National Loan Scholarship, National Scholarship and stipend for the physically challenged students etc.

- 6) Govt. of India also awards a few scholarships to students belonging to SC, ST and OBC categories.
- 7) Nearly 10% of the students are given financial assistance from the Students' Aid Fund annually. The selection is made on the basis of merit, financial status and attendance.
- 8) Eleven Stipends are provided by our Alumni Association.

• **MEDALS**

- 1) Dr. Satish Bose (founder secretary of the college) Memorial Medal is given to a student who secures highest marks among the college students in the University final examination.
- 2) Suparna Bose Memorial Medal is given by Prof. Dr. Barindra Kumar Basu (Ex-student) to a student who secures highest marks in B. Com (Hons.) amongst the college students.

• **HEALTH CENTRE & STUDENTS' HEALTH HOME:**

The Health Centres located in both the campuses provide limited medical testing and medication. These remain open daily and function on a limited time schedule through visiting physicians.

College is a universal member of Students' Health Home. Students are entitled to receive services from Barrackpore unit and Central unit of the Students' Health Home.

• **CATERING SERVICE :**

The college, with the assistance of the students' union, runs two well located and airy canteens in both campuses for the benefit of the students. Students' canteen in both the buildings has been renovated as modular kitchen with the expertise of Kutchina under the RUSA fund. The college also runs one canteen for the teaching and non-teaching staffs, each of both the campuses.

• **COUNSELLING:**

Faculty members are also available to students for consultation and advice on academic, personal & social problems. There are cubicles in the library for academic counselling. Students can have their specific academic problems sorted out with the help of their Departmental teachers.

• **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL:**

The college has a Grievance Redressal Cell to address the grievances and suggestions of the students and staff. Complaint and suggestion boxes are placed at strategic points in both campuses for this purpose.

• **HOSTEL :**

A three storied Girls' Hostel is now complete and it can now accommodate 60 students. The hostel building was funded by UGC under Women Hostel Development Scheme. The accommodation (with attached bath facility) is now supporting the girl students coming from nearby districts and are interested to study in this college in different UG and PG courses. The construction of the Boys' Hostel is complete and it will come into operation from this academic session 2017-18. The hostel building is built under the state Govt fund and it has present accommodation of 24 students.



• **GYMNASIUM :**

The college has two gymnasiums with a 17-unit multi-gym facility for the students (both boys & girls) in both the buildings separately. These give support to both boys and girls for their health care.

• **STUDENT PROGRESSION**

The success rate of students at the University level examinations has touched 100% and the performance of students after passing out has been equally encouraging. Many of our students pursue post-graduate studies in Biotechnology, IT, Microbiology, B. Tech, MCA, MBA, M.A., M.Sc., M. Com., CA etc. in different institutions of national and international repute. A number of UG students of Microbiology, Computer Sc. and Commerce are also admitted in the PG Courses of the college. A good number of students are also pursuing their post graduation in different Universities of the State and other states.

• **ALUMNI**

Many of our former students are well established in their social life. They are engaged in different occupations such as teaching, research activity, service sector, banking sector, journalism, practicing law, business, etc. Alumni of our college have established an Alumni Association 'Praktanika' in 2001 and it is registered {S/1L/51372 session 2007-2008} under Society Registration Act, 1961. The association holds a re-union on 1st Sunday of December every year. On that occasion, our students securing first class (UG and PG both) in the immediate preceding year, are felicitated.

• **BRSC CENTRE FOR CAREER DEVELOPMENT**

Institutional Career Development Cell is working for value added education amongst the students. It develops the communication skill, soft skill and aptitude of the students so that they can perform better in the job market.

• **PLACEMENT CELL**

The college runs a well organised placement cell. It has been successfully organizing campus recruitment programmes

for jobs in the IT, ITES, pharmaceutical, financial and insurance field. Multi-national and National organizations such as CTS, Infosys, Wipro BPO, Genpact, IBM Daksh, Satyam Computer, Tech-Mahindra, ITC, India Foils, India Bulls, ACC Ltd. etc. have offered jobs to our final year students since 2006-07 session. One Placement Officer is assigned for successful organization of campus recruitments.

Co-Curricular: Co-curricular activities are an integral part of college life. These make for academic excellence, help to create a sense of social & moral responsibility and also provide opportunities for all-round development and physical relaxation.

NCC: The College has one NCC Unit under 48 Battalion. The Unit has been functioning very effectively for the last three decades. Our cadets have made us proud by winning medals and trophies on various prestigious occasions.

NSS: The College has two NSS Units which are undertaking various community oriented programmes over the years. NSS Units conduct a HIV awareness programme every year with different schools of the locality successfully and also organize a blood donation camp every year in the 6, Riverside Road campus of the

college in collaboration with B.N. Bose Hospital, Barrackpore.

Extra-Curricular: The objective of the extra-curricular activities is to promote the cultural and social activities of the students.

Social Functions: Social functions are organized by the Students' Union every year. Its highlights being the Basant Utsav, Hindi Diwas, Women's Day, Bhasha Diwas, Independence Day, Republic Day etc.

Creative Writing:

Magazine: Annual Magazine of the college is published every year. A subcommittee of students, teachers & non-teaching staffs headed by a faculty member has been set up to look after the quality of the write-ups and printing aspects. Writings in Bengali, English, Hindi & Urdu are accommodated to portray the multilingual character of the college.

Wall Magazine: All Departments have been organizing the publication of handwritten wall magazines. This helps the students to develop the habit of creative writing. The college encourages students to express their writing skill through other writing competitions.

Cultural Competition: A very popular annual event is the cultural event, "Sagnik", organised by the Students' Union. This week-long programme includes cultural competitions and provides a platform for students to express their talents and interests.

Seminar / Workshop :

1. Organizing seminars and workshops is a regular academic exercise prevalent in our college with active participation by teachers and students of each

2. Eight (08) State / National Level Seminars / workshops has been organised by the college under the guidance of IQAC during academic session 2017-18. Distinguished & eminent persons from academic and other professional fields acted as resource persons in these seminars/ workshops.

INNOVATIVE PRACTICES

•Health Awareness Programme:

The college has set up a Health Subcommittee comprising of faculty members and Student representatives. The committee has been organizing health awareness programmes, which include Thalassaemia Carrier Detection Test followed by personal counselling, Hepatitis B vaccination programme, seminar on Adolescent Health emphasizing problems of Girls students.

•Students' Feed Back:

The college has developed a system whereby the students get the opportunity to put on record their assessment in regard to all aspects of the college. The senior most students of the college (both at UG & PG levels) who are invited to fill in a structured questionnaire indicating the gradation of their choice without disclosing their identity. The outcome of the Feedback Report is reviewed by every Department and remedial measures are taken.

•Parent – Teacher Association:

The college has formed a parent – teacher association to establish a linkage between the society and the institution. The college has a good practice to organize meetings with the parents every year during the month of Feb – Mar. Parents meet the Department first and then also meet the Principal centrally. In all these meetings they interact about the performance and limitations of their wards and suggest some measures for the improvement of their wards, Departments and the institution. The College takes active part to fulfill the demands of the students as reflected in the parents' meeting.

•Performance Appraisal of Teachers:

The College has been maintaining performance appraisal of teachers in a specially structured day-wise sheet for more than ten years. From this databank, teacher-wise number of classes allotted and number of classes taken are prepared and displayed in the notice board on half yearly / annual basis for general information. It also covers examination duty allotted and examination duty performed by an individual teacher. On the average 85 to 90% of the allotted classes are held for the last decade. A derailed academic Diary has been introduced for self appraisal of Teachers.

•Earn and Learn:

This programme is in operation since 2004-05. The project has enabled the students to engage themselves in activities such as campus cleaning, gardening, library upkeep, maintaining playground etc. The students, participating in the project, are given financial benefits in any form. The objective of the project is two fold: First, to develop a sense of dignity of labour and second, earning part of his/her cost of study.

• Linkage: The college has taken the initiative to develop linkage with some national organizations, institutions and Universities for extension of research activities, teacher-student exchange programme etc. A MOU has been signed with Nadia Zilla Parishad where by the college will act as a consultant institution in areas of survey and research. A team of marketing experts from the college will provide marketing assistance to the self-help groups under Nadia Zilla Parishad.

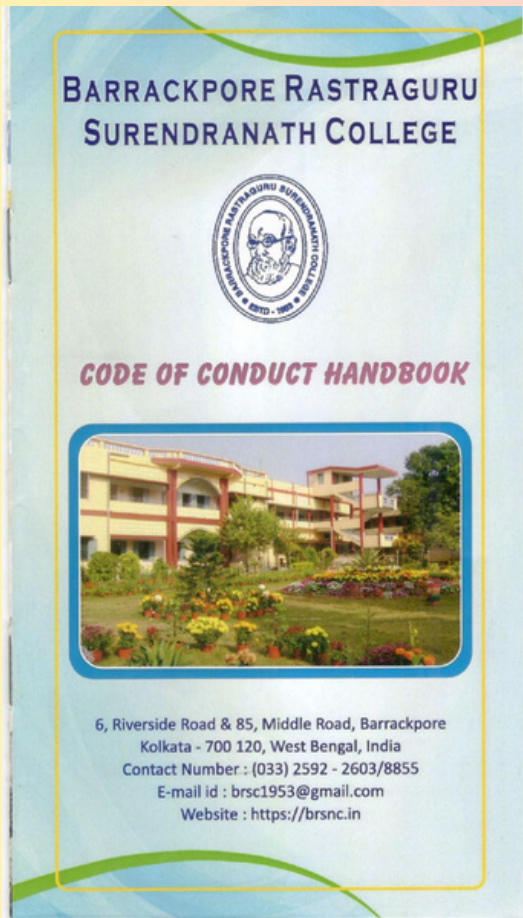
